By the successful completion of this minor, a student should be able to demonstrate:

1. Knowledge of the complex network of issues around food and food systems, particularly in an urban environment.
2. An understanding of the historical, political, cultural, environmental, and economic structures influencing food and food systems.
3. An understanding of global systems and the ability to think critically and creatively about these systems, and problem-solve with an entrepreneurial approach.
4. The ability to incorporate his/her skills and knowledge of food systems with other areas of interest such as design, writing, management and media.
5. The ability to work collaboratively or individually with different stake holders to address issues that intersect academia, business, and the nonprofit sector.
6. In-depth knowledge of a particular area of food and food systems, e.g., food health and the environment, in the student's chosen concentration.
