Eugene Lang College has partnered with The New School for Public Engagement to offer interdisciplinary studies in Jewish Culture. Drawing on courses across the university, this program allows students the opportunity to study Jewish classic texts, sacred and secular, and Jewish history from the time of Abraham to the present. Lang students minoring in Jewish Studies will take six courses, distributed as set forth below. Courses are chosen in consultation with the Director of the Program, Prof. Val Vinokur (65 W11th St., #253; [VinokurV@newschool.edu](mailto:VinokurV@newschool.edu)). Students must submit a plan to the program director for their course of study when they declare the minor. Students must earn a grade of C or higher for the course to count toward the Jewish Studies program.

### Minor Requirements: Five (5) courses, distributed as follows:
