Freshman/Regular Admission

High school seniors who expect to complete a minimum of 16 credits of academic work or the equivalent may apply as freshmen. Students who have been enrolled at another college or university for less than one full academic year, or who are unsure of the transferability of their college credits, should apply as freshmen.

Deadlines: January 6 for fall entry

November 1 for spring entry

Freshman/Early Decision

Students who plan to enter college in the fall and select Eugene Lang College as their first choice may apply as Early Decision (ED) candidates. The student will be notified of an admission decision in mid-December, prior to the notification date for Regular Admission candidates. ED applicants will be considered for fall entry only and are not permitted to file ED applications with any other college or university. If admitted, an ED candidate agrees to withdraw all applications for regular admission elsewhere and enroll at Eugene Lang College.

Deadline: November 1

Freshman/Early Entrance

Each year Eugene Lang College offers admission to a limited number of students who are interested in beginning college early in lieu of completing the final year of high school. Such students must demonstrate evidence of strong academic promise and have the support of their high school. Arrangements to obtain the high school diploma upon successful completion of the first year at Eugene Lang College must be made with the student's high school prior to admission.

Deadline: January 6

HEOP

The Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) is an academic support program established by the state of New York in 1970. It enables motivated students who lack sufficient academic preparation and financial resources to pursue a college degree. To meet the specific need of its students, HEOP provides counseling, tutoring, academic advisement and financial assistance.

To qualify for HEOP, applicants must meet the criteria established by the New York State Education Department: State Residency: Must be a citizen or permanent resident of the US who has resided in New York State for a minimum of a year;

School Preparation: Applicant must be a high school graduate of a holder of General Equivalency Diploma (GED); and

Financial Eligibility: Applicants must demonstrate eligibility as defined by the State.

Admission Deadline: January 6th (fall entry only)
Financial Aid Deadline: March 1st

Students interested in transferring into The New School HEOP program from another HEOP program should contact the HEOP office at 212-229-8996.

Transfer/Regular Admission

Students who have completed at least 12 semester-hour credits (one full semester) at a college or university, whether foreign or within the United States, may apply as transfer students.

Deadlines: Rolling between January 1 and April 1 for fall entry;

November 1 for spring entry

New York Connections/Visiting Students

College sophomores, juniors, and, in some cases, seniors who are matriculated at other institutions may apply for one semester or one year of full-time study as a Visiting Student. Contact the Office of Admission for further information and an application.

Deadlines: May 1 for fall entry

November 1 for spring entry

BA/BFA Dual Degree Admission

High school seniors and current college students interested in applying for the five-year Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Fine Arts dual degree program offered jointly by Eugene Lang College and Parsons The New School for Design or The New School for Jazz and Contemporary Music may apply as freshmen or transfers. Students applying for a dual degree program must complete the online application at www.newschool.edu/lang.

November 1 spring deadline

Parsons February 1 fall deadline

Special Student Admission

Individuals interested in taking courses at Lang as non-degree students may apply as Special Students. Special Students are not permitted to take more than four classes per semester for a maximum of two semesters. Contact the Office of Admission for further information and a Special Student application form. Please note that Special Students are not eligible for on-campus housing or institutional financial aid.

Deadlines: May 1 for fall term

November 1 for spring term

Financial Aid

Financial aid awards take into consideration both financial need and merit. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be submitted in order to determine an applicant's eligibility for aid. It should be completed at the time application is made to Eugene Lang College. This will increase the student's chance of being notified sooner about financial aid awards. The priority deadline for submitting the FAFSA is March 1. Students must request that the results be sent to The New School. It is also a good idea to keep photocopies of your financial documents.
