#### 7. Two Personal Essays

Essay 1: Autobiographical Essay (250-500 word limit, 2-pages). In a short autobiographical essay, tell us about yourself. You can write about your family, your education, your talents, or your passions, about significant places or events in your life; about books you have read, people you have met, or work you've done that has shaped the person you have become. In addition, this is the essay to explain any strengths or weaknesses you may have (real or perceived), e.g., low GPA, lack of experience, significant interruption in work or studies, or any other information you wish to share. Our only requirements are that the essay be informative, well written, and reflective of your own voice. We caution you to avoid poetry, purple prose, or writing about yourself in the third person.

Essay 2: Academic Interests (500-750 word limit, 3-pages). Please describe the academic and intellectual interests, progress, and achievements that have contributed to your decision to apply for post-graduate study. You should include a thoughtful description of your tentative plan of study or area of inquiry at The New School for Social Research as you now envision it, the kind of research questions you intend to pursue, and what you hope or expect to do after you've completed the degree. In addition, include a stringent self-assessment of your work as a scholar, pointing out strengths and weaknesses. If you have not been enrolled as a student in the past five years, we would like to know what opportunities and challenges you foresee in pursuing your program choice, as well as how you expect to change your career path after completing this program. Please submit ONLY the requested information. Be sure that document includes your name, number of essay and page(s) in the header. Do not upload blank documents or notes; this will slow down the processing of your application. Remember, you are always able to log out of this application and complete it later. If you do not have a document ready to submit, complete the document first; then upload your file and submit your application when all your materials are ready.

## 8. Required Academic Writing Sample

An academic writing sample, in English, is required. This writing sample may be a paper submitted for a course, a journal article, or an excerpt from either, of ten to twenty pages. Your writing sample must be an original work written by yourself. **Coauthored work will not be accepted.** To be considered for the PhD program in Anthropology, Philosophy, and Political Science, a more substantial writing sample (e.g., a master's thesis or a major research paper) is required. **Writing Samples submitted via CD, audiotape, or DVD will not be accepted.**
