Articulation Agreement between Borough of Manhattan Community College and The New School

The New School Bachelor's Program is designed to offer transfer students a broad, ambitious, and stimulating curriculum in the liberal arts. Knowing that transfer students and adults come with rich and diverse backgrounds, as well as their own passions and curiosities, we do not impose distribution requirements; instead students work closely with their faculty advisors to develop personalized programs of study. In our program you'll find degree options for students who prefer to do all their coursework online, an accelerated bachelor's/master's study option, internships, and individual academic and career advising. We think you'll find the program innovative, challenging, and flexible. Our program allows you to study in a wide range of areas. These include, but are not limited to: filmmaking, creative writing, environmental studies, psychology, the visual arts, international affairs, urban studies, visual studies, literature, languages, global studies, media studies, philosophy, non-fiction writing, business, and food studies.

Articulation Agreement Highlights

1. Admission to the Bachelor's Program is guaranteed* to BMCC graduates meeting all requirements in the formal agreement and who earn an Associate's degree in one of the following majors:

- a. A.A. Liberal Arts (60-62 credits)
- b. A.A. Writing and Literature (60-62 credits)
- c. A.A.S. Multimedia Programming and Design (60 credits)
- d. A.A.S. Video Arts & Technology (60 credits)

* The New School reserves the right to deny admission to any student who does not meet our academic requirements or code of conduct.

2. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required for graduates who are admitted via this agreement, and students must enroll at The New School for the semester immediately following their BMCC graduation.

3. This articulation agreement allows a student to transfer all the required credits needed to complete the associate degree programs listed above. The bachelor's degree can then be completed upon reaching 120 total credits.

4. The New School offers two scholarships specifically for community college graduates. The first is the *Academic Opportunity Grant*, awarded on the basis of merit and need to community college graduates who demonstrate qualities contributing to the strength and diversity of the student body. The second is linked to the *PTK Honors Society*, whereby members are considered for need and merit-based scholarships in recognition of their academic achievement as community college students.
