OVERVIEW

The minor in Film Production helps students develop a practical hands-on understanding of how to create a short film from conception through to completion. By the successful completion of this minor, a student should be able to demonstrate:

- Technical and conceptual skills necessary for the planning, production, and editing of short film (Digital or 16mm shooting format, digital exhibition format).
- Familiarity with operation of 16mm and HD cameras, supports, audio, lighting, and grip equipment and ability to deploy appropriately.
- Basic practical understanding of film stock, film speed, lenses, and principles of exposure, basic lighting, and audio recording.
- Ability to use editing/post-production software.
- Understanding of professional protocols and demonstrated ability to work on crews and collaborate on the production of a film project.

Note: Course availability may vary from semester to semester. Students seeking to pursue alternative coursework to fulfill the minor should consult with their advisors.

* It is recommended that students completing the Film Production Minor additionally take NFLM 3411 Art of Film (3 Credits) concurrently with NFLM 3600 Filmmaking Studio 1. Students who take NFLM

3411 Art of Film (3-credits) and an additional 3-credit elective *and* maintain a grade of B or better in all of their required courses will also be eligible for a Certificate in Film Production.

ELIGIBILITY

Minors are available to undergraduate students across The New School **except** those students at Lang and the Bachelors Program for Adults and Transfer Students who are completing a self-designed BA or BS in Liberal Arts, who are not permitted to declare minors. For students at Lang or the Bachelors Program for Adults and Transfer Students interested in pursuing a deeper study of this subject area, opportunities are available through the self-designed major in Liberal Arts.
