The bulb in the LCD projector takes time to warm up and time to cool down.

Make sure it is completely cooled and off before unplugging from an electrical outlet.

Mirroring on the Mac

1. To project your Mac... Step 1

a. Connect the **SVGA and adapter cables to your laptop**, and power on the LCD projector. If you're in a presentation classroom, the SVGA cable is already connected to the projector. Make sure the projector is set on the correct input. *



b. To have the **image mirrored**, press **F7** on the laptop, or go to the **monitor icon** in the upper-right corner of the desktop. In the pull-down menu, select **Turn On Mirroring**.

2. To get audio from the Mac to LCD projector

a. Plug one end of **mini-mini audio cable (See Fig 1)** into the laptop audio output (headphones jack), and plug the other end in to the **Computer/Component** audio input of the projector. *

b. Make sure the volume of the Mac is up by checking under Sound in System Preferences.

Mirroring on the Windows PC

1. To project your PC desktop... Step 1

a. With the **SVGA cable connected**, power on the LCD projector. Press the key with the **monitor icon** (usually F4) to mirror the image. Some PCs require that you also hold the **Funcion (fn)** key.

2. To get audio from the PC to LCD projector

a. Plug one end of **mini-mini audio cable (See Fig. 1)** in to the laptop audio output (headphones jack), and plug the other end in to the **Computer/Component** audio input of the projector.

b. The volume control of the projector is located on the top. Make sure the volume of the PC is up by checking under the Volume Control in the control panel.

Campus Network

Connecting to the Campus Network will give you access to the Internet, and applications like CS2. It does not give access to The New School printers.

To connect to the Network, you have two options:

1. **Go wireless on newschoolnet.** (see Wireless tip sheet).

2. **Use network cable. (See Fig. 2)** Plug it into the laptop and into a port in the rack at the front of your classroom. If there is no rack, use a port in the wall.

If you are using the network cable and getting a wireless signal too, your laptop will default to connect through the cable. If the cable is not getting a live signal, try another port, or go wireless.
