## COLLECTIONS

New School Libraries and Archives is comprised of the Fogelman (humanities and social sciences), Gimbel (art and design), Kellen (archival design materials) and Scherman (music) collections. Altogether, these collections support The New School's interdisciplinary approach to education and offer an excellent starting place for research. The specialized holdings of each collection include a wealth of books, journals, scores, sound and video, primary source materials and visual images that are available to every member of the New School community. ## THE KELLEN DESIGN ARCHIVES

The Kellen Design Archives in the Sheila C. Design Center is home to primary source materials in the areas of 20th and 21st century American fashion, interior, and graphic design, architecture, environmental design, illustration, photography, lighting and product design.

**The Kellen Design Archives** also documents the history of Parsons, and is home to several small collections of primary source materials that document The New School from the period before Parsons became part of the university.
