Dissertation Abstract

My dissertation studies the Wage Share-Unemployment relationship in Advanced Economies and presents my research in three essays. In Essays 1&2, a model of the rate of change of the wage share is used to identify technological change, the size of government and the degree of unionization as the main drivers of the wage share, while Essay 3 more closely examines the real wage, productivity and unemployment relationship to evaluate the response of the wage share to unemployment. It has three main conclusions: in the US the impact of unemployment increased as the economy transitioned into the “Neo-Liberal Era”; in Advanced Economies the decline of the wage share is caused by a reduction in the bargaining power of workers driven primarily by technological change, declining size of government and unionization; a reversal of the downward trend could be achieved with more “ Progressive” Governance through the implementation of Policies and Programs that strengthen the bargaining position of workers.
